KOINONIA Room 304

Koinonia class uses the **Faithlink** series. **Faithlink** educates United Methodist Christians on current issues and promotes spiritual growth. Each week, they explore current topics, with background information and related Bible passages that speak to the issues.

Since the lessons are electronically sent to the Church each week, the subjects are timely and the information current. Class members with email are sent the lesson prior to Sunday School. Time is given at the beginning of the lesson to review the material. They then discuss the topic in that issue and talk about how as a church or as individuals they can respond and act on it. Faithlink makes every effort to present different sides to each issue and supplies interesting statistics to back up the statements.

WESLEY FELLOWSHIP Chapel

This group, which meets in the Chapel is made up of older adults. There are 65 members of which 24 are unable to attend, but are still considered part of the class. While many in this class have been together for decades, new members are always welcomed warmly into their fellowship.



The group participates in church outreach activities by donating to the: Florida Children's Home; Lighthouse Children's Home; Vashti, Elder Care Services; and the Wesley Foundation. They also fund the purchase of our third-grade Bibles.

Each year, from September to May, topics of general interest and spiritual growth are presented.

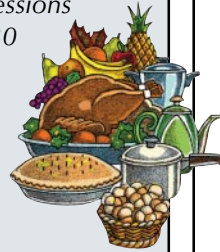
Classes are open to the general public in addition to the Trinity congregation.

AN OVERVIEW

Since Trinity is such a diverse church, there are a lot of different classes in the **9:45 a.m. Adult Education program**. There are classes that meet every need.

The following is just a brief synopsis of what Trinity provides. Adults may choose from many different Sunday morning classes. Each class caters to a different age group or different area of interest.

ADULT BIBLE STUDY Room 301

This is a fellowship of people, single and married, who study the Bible in depth in order to gain a firm Biblical foundation for their faith.

Class members share teacher/leader assignments with informal discussion and active member participation.

This class uses the **Adult Bible Studies Series**. The topic this quarter is **Human Commitment** which draws from the book of Luke and Old Testament writings.

ALDERSGATE Room 302

The ages represented in the class vary widely, from the mid-thirties to fifty plus.



Since the very beginning, Aldersgate has been a class characterized by lively discussions and an interest in wide-ranging topics. It is not a lecture class and the topics studied are not restricted

to the Bible, although Bible studies are certainly an important component of the subjects explored.

Over the years, Aldersgate's studies have ranged over a wide array of Christian writings from history to scripture; from the Book of Common Prayer to contemporary issues.

Class time is preceded by social time at 9:45 a.m., during which we catch up with each other's lives, followed by discussion of the scheduled topic or study at approximately 10 a.m.

In addition to Sunday morning class studies, the class holds monthly social events, alternating between adult-only events, such as dinners and movies, and family events, such as bowling, beach days and picnics. Aldersgate also has a Christmas brunch - a much-anticipated event that grows each year, with some of the members now bringing grandchildren along.

Aldersgate engages in frequent service projects, including assisting a needy family with house painting, clothing, and holiday meals and gifts. The class as a whole volunteers to serve meals at "The Shelter" and has been involved in the ECHO back-to-school drive and restocking the HEO pantry.

BETTY PHIFER Room 307

The class is made up of members who are interested in stepping out and doing some tough thinking. They are of all ages, couples and singles, and are always happy to see new faces on Sunday mornings.

Some of the issues studied in the past are: abortion, the death penalty, homosexuality, world hunger, criminal justice, and conservation.

The class also tries to keep up with the United Methodist Church as a world church, and study other denominations and religions to see what they have to offer Christians. They will be researching what other annual conferences did this year to see how the church as a whole is responding to the world today.

The class has socials from time to time and participate in class projects for the good of our community.

BIBLE JOURNEYS Room 306

This class consists of men and women of "baby-boomer" age and older. However, adults of all ages are invited to attend this



warm and friendly group. Many members are actively retired professionals who travel extensively, and enjoy cultural activities offered in the area as well as ... the Seminoles! Socially, the group has the occasional dinner at a member's home.

The focus of the class is to facilitate an in-depth, interactive study of God's Word through the teachings of the Bible and

commentaries of selected authors and teachers who hold to the conservative Christian faith.

The service and mission of the class is general participation in church-wide activities including cooking for **The Shelter** and collecting school supplies and clothing for children in need.

EMPOWERING PARENTS Room 310

This new group is made up of parents with young children. They study the same topics as the children's curriculum "Live



B.I.G." but from an adult perspective. This is a great group for parents of elementary and preschool parents to get to know and support each other while keeping up with what their children are learning in their classes.
