Trinity gives help to HOPE House

The March issue of **Tidings** announced the start of a major outreach initiative to improve living conditions for homeless children and their parents at the Hope Community homeless shelter. Trinity members have responded in typical and enthusiastic fashion through volunteering time and money to this worthy effort. Through April, four residential bedrooms will have been painted ceiling to floor and upgraded with new interior furnishings

including extensive cabinetry, rugs, bedding and blinds. Before and after photos of these rooms are shown below. But, there is much more to be done in this long term ongoing project. Continued priority is focused on 10 remaining bedrooms, nine bathrooms, and improvements to the laundry room. How can you, as a Trinity member, become involved?:

 Make a personal cash contribution payable to Trinity United Methodist Church (Note on check: For Hope Project). Materials costs are running about \$500 per room.

• Volunteer a day or more of your time to help with clean up and painting of rooms. Each room takes two persons about two days for cleaning, preparation and painting. Dear Friends,

We're now on the other side of Easter. Like the beautiful season of spring, it is a time of new beginnings, new life, new birth. A prayer that I have been using daily speaks powerfully of beginnings. It was written by a Presbyterian minister, Ted Loder, and I offer it to you. You might want to pay particular attention to what he says in the last few lines about growing older. Maybe it will speak to you as it did to me.

God of history and of my heart, so much has happened to me over the years: I've known death and birth; I've been brave and scared; I've hurt, I've helped; I've been honest, I've lied; I've destroyed, I've created; I've been with people, I've been lonely; I've been loyal, I've betrayed; I've decided, I've waffled; I've laughed and I've cried. You know my frail heart and my frayed history.

O God, help me to believe in beginnings and in my beginning again, no matter how often I've failed before. Help me to make beginnings: to begin going out of my weary mind into fresh dreams, daring to make my own bold tracks in the land of now; to begin forgiving that I may experience mercy; to begin questioning the unquestionable that I may know truth; to begin disciplining that I may create beauty; to begin sacrificing that I may accomplish justice; to begin risking that I may make peace; to begin loving that I may realize joy.



Help me to be a beginning for others, to be a singer to the songless, a storyteller to the aimless, a befriender of the friendless, to become a beginning of hope for the despairing, or assurance for the doubting, of reconciliation for the divided; to become a beginning of beauty for the forlorn, of sweetness for the soured, of gentleness for the angry, of wholeness for the broken, of peace for the frightened and violent of the earth.

Help me to believe in beginnings, to make a beginning, to be a beginning, so that I may not just grow old, but grow new each day of this wild, amazing life you call me to live with the passion of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Friends, we are three months into our 95210 journey. "How are you doing?" I hope you are feeling a positive difference in your life with the changes you are making. For me and my family, we are doing well. I'm happy to report that according to my doctor's scale, I've lost around ten pounds.

I was going to take my tennis shoes so I could exercise in the hotel gym - but forgot them.
