Did you know about 600 students regularly attend the two weekly services at the Wesley Foundation on the Florida State University campus? That number was 782

for Easter Sunday. The Chapel of the Upper Room on Jefferson Street was crammed to capacity. And the atmosphere was festive It was Easter Fest 2012! After all, Easter Sunday is a celebration of the greatest miracle of all time Christ overcame death on the cross to save us from our sins!

But this was no ordinary Easter service. This was a service about making a difference in the world Being the light that Jesus calls us to be! The message and challenge from Pastor Rains and his leadership team was to change one life forever...the life of a little girl.

That little girl's name is Yanapat. She is three years old and from Chiang Mai, Thailand. If \$6000 could be raised, then Yanapat would be educated and receive health care until she reached adulthood. This sponsorship would help keep her safe from the threat of human trafficking which is so prevalent

among uneducated girls in Southeast Asia. By each person putting in the offering plate just \$10, the students of FSU Wesley would be able to sponsor this one little girl until she reached adulthood. The light of Jesus Christ shown that Sunday morning and \$6300 was raised. One Life Changed Forever!!!



That struck home - even the little things matter (example - \$10). You don't have to be a Mother Teresa to make a difference in someone's life. The world is being impacted by the students at the FSU Wesley Foundation.

The NETkids also went on the road to perform for the residents of Westminster. They had a very warm reception:






