
Dear Friends,

### WinM to Raise Funds for School Back Pack Program

At their Tuesday, December 2, luncheon meeting, Women in Ministry (UMW) will face a challenge imposed by their Executive Committee:

Bring donations to help raise at least \$1,000 for Second Harvest of the Big Bend's School Back Pack Program. Funding previously provided by government and social services agencies was greatly reduced this year and many at risk children no longer are given a bag of food to take home on Fridays to help feed their families over the weekend.

Trinity's Women in Ministry (UMW) help pack the bags once a month and know how much families whose children eat at school during the week depend upon the bag of canned fruit, vegetables and staples. They took \$400 out of their budget as a starter gift and are calling on fellow members and concerned members of the church to pitch in to reach their goal. Any money contributed during December will be matched 2 to 1 by a Second Harvest benefactor.

UMW will install new officers for the 2015 year during the December luncheon

beginning at 11:15 in Moor Hall. All women of the church are invited to attend.

# Members join on Celebration Sunday


