I love Psalm 150 as it reminds me of the joy of worship together! Although we will be unable to sing together in our sanctuary, we can still enjoy the beauty of our pipe organ and piano as well as the many musical instruments played by many of our members. I'm looking forward to gathering with you this month as we literally "pull out the stops" on the organ to welcome our Trinity family back into our beautiful sanctuary. Brett Ingram and our sextons have been deep cleaning and polishing everything to provide a safe and secure environment upon our return.

We will provide hospitality teams to guide you into the sanctuary and answer any questions you might have about worship.



We are encouraging everyone to bring their own masks, but we will provide one if you forgot to bring a mask with you to worship. Our recent reduction of virus infections in Florida has been attributed to a higher percentage of the population now wearing masks.

After waiting almost six months to the day through the COVID-19 pandemic, (March 22 – September 20), we are finally at a place where your pastors and the leadership of Trinity feel we can carefully begin to return to in-person worship at 11:00am in our sanctuary. On October 18, we will add our 9:45am service in Moor Hall. The truth is, Trinity never stopped worshiping.



We never missed a Sunday and have been online through our new livestreamed service since March 22. Since our first online worship service with two iPhones on tripods, we have installed a video control panel in the balcony of our sanctuary, made possible through the generosity of Dr. Orson and Eleanor Smith.

Our members continue to contribute to the improvement of our video and sound systems for video and radio broadcasts.

As we plan to gather for worship again on September 20 at 11:00am, many things related to our presence in worship will be different. Page 2 covers the list of protocols and expectations for those returning to in-person worship in our Trinity sanctuary.

### Update (Continued)



- 1. Worshippers will need to register through Sign-Up Genius online at www. tumct.org and agree to keep a Covenant of established protocols. These will be listed for you to affirm when your register online for worship. Due to physical distancing, our total number of worshipers will be limited to 65 persons in the main sanctuary. Each person attending in your family will need to register through Sigh-Up Genius and there will be no standing reservations. Each week registration will open on Tuesday and stay open until all slots are filled. When you arrive for 11:00am Worship, please plan to arrive early to check in at the Registration Table on Park Avenue under the portico. Touchless thermometers will be used to check your temperature before you can enter the narthex.
- **2.** Temperatures will be checked by a touchless scanner before entering the building and will need to register no more than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit.
- **3.** Hand sanitizing will be required upon entering and leaving the sanctuary. Please enter and exit through the double doors at the Park Avenue entrance.
- **4.** All those choosing to attend in person worship at Trinity will agree to wear a mask.



- **5.** Physical distancing of six feet or more will be required except for members of the same family.
- **6.** All those attending worship in person acknowledge that there will be NO congregational singing.
- **7.** Seating will be designated and guided by hosts from our greeting team.
- **8.** We are unable to offer childcare at this time, but children are welcome to sit with their parents.
- **9.** Persons may want to consider alternating their Sundays for worship to allow other persons an opportunity to attend. We will be able to add another 45 seats in Moor Hall when we open the 9:45am service on October 18.

Additional letters and instructions to the congregation will be going out weekly in September as we prepare to begin worshipping together on September 20. Thank you for your patience and care for one another as we enter into this time of renewing our call to worship together! ### New Office Procedures

As we transition into our "new normal" at Trinity, we would like to share new procedures for visiting the church and office during the week, beginning on September 21. We are hopeful that this plan will keep you, staff members, and the building as safe as possible!

• Please make an appointment.

If you need to physically come to the office for any reason, please make an appointment, preferably 24 hours in advance (even if you are simply dropping something off or picking something up). This will ensure that there are not too many people in the same area at one time. This will also be helpful to our Staff as they balance social distancing and working remotely when possible, with completing necessary in-person tasks. Lastly, this will ensure that the area is able to be properly disinfected before the next appointment. You can make an appointment by calling 850-222-1120 or by emailing the staff member you wish to see.

- Please enter through the Welcome Center Door. Upon arrival, please enter through the Welcome Center Door. Trinity has a large facility and using this particular entrance/exit will help our facilities staff keep the building clean and safe. We will also have a screening station set up in this area.
- Upon entering, please wear a mask, sanitize your hands, have your temperature taken, and sign in. Masks are required inside our building and we also ask that you sanitize your hands at the door. A staff member will also be present to take your temperature using a no-contact thermometer. Signing in will help us keep track of everyone coming and going, and will help us know who to notify in case we do experience a positive COVID-19 test at any point.
- While in the building, please be mindful of restricted areas. There are many areas in the building (rooms, bathrooms, etc.) that are currently restricted by our

facilities staff to ensure a clean and safe building. Please avoid those restricted areas on your way to and from your appointment.




# Welcome Trina Murphy! Our Amazing Office Assistant

### A Good Conscience

A few weeks back, my family and I did some of our back to school shopping. So to not to increase our chances of contracting Covid-19, we shopped during low volume hours. Within a few days, one of us had a fever with accompanying body aches and pains. The doctor told us to quarantine in our home, and our loved one would need to further isolate to one bedroom.

I have diligently worn my mask in grocery stores, gas stations, emergency rooms, front porches, church offices, and worship services. What first felt almost smothering in the Florida humidity has become surprisingly second nature. I've even unconsciously worn a mask in the car without passengers.

It all came as quite a shock. We had followed all the rules: wearing masks, distancing ourselves from others by six feet, and creating a safe bubble with a few others who practiced the same. It felt unfair witnessing others lax about following CDC guidelines. I remembered feeling something in common with the psalmist who complained to God about doing the right thing, while others flaunted their freedom. We even questioned whether wearing a mask indoors at this point made any difference at all.

The encouraging words of Thomas a' Kempis kept coming back to me, "A good conscience is better than gold." We agreed this was enough for us and chose to wear a mask in our home. Whether or not we tested positive for Covid-19, our conscience was being tested. There's something golden about putting others before self. No regrets. No shame.

John Wesley taught us that there was a method to our Christianity when he said, "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." This is real wisdom because it still rings true today.

When our test results arrived by email, I gasped when my eyes saw the first bold word on the page, "preference." I thought it said positive, and I realized just how scary the week had truly been. Thankfully all of our results were negative.
