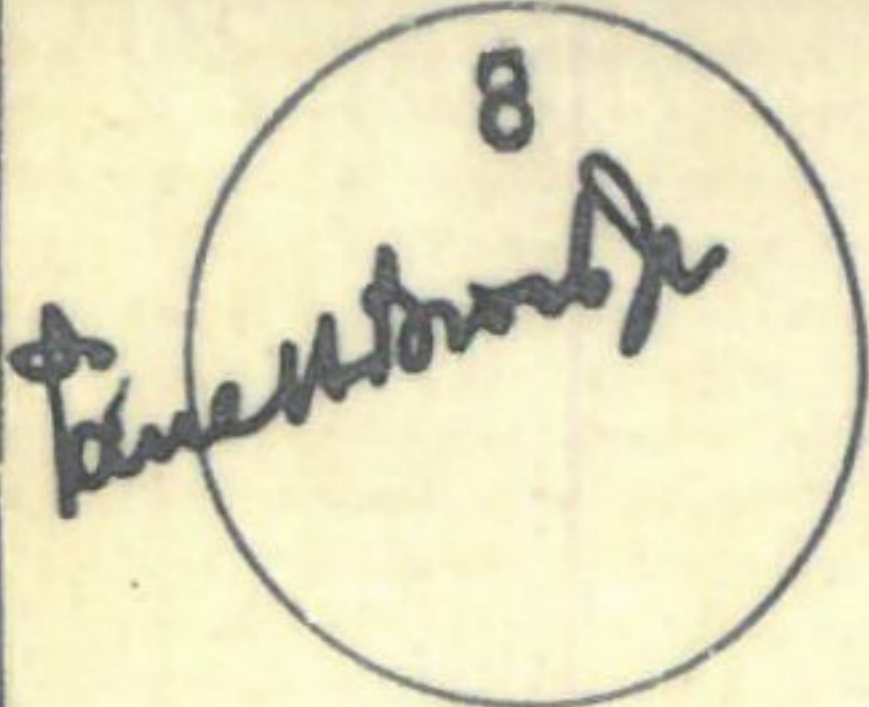

Somewhere in North Africa

This is quite an experiment and very different from what we are expected. Now that the newness has worn off it's quite dull around here but we didn't come over to have a good time so everything is going as well as could be expected. We are training very hard and looking forward to the "Big Day" to come. From all indications it won't be long now. I only hope that our outfit will be able to do as well as the other American troops that have been here since it started.

The next time you take a shower think of us and one quart of water and a tin hat for our daily bath. It's really surprising though, how clean you can get even with this limited supply.

Tell my folks and friends "hello" when you see them and I'm really sincere in my belief that I will see you at your church Christmas.
