I am glad John is attending your church and social gatherings, as he will never do any harm attending church he says he enjoys going, as he doesn't drink or smoke, unless he has started since I have seen him.

I kept up for 2 weeks and then on the 26th Jan. went to bed and just got up yesterday afternoon, I stay up a few hours and then lay down again.

The boys didn't know how sick I was James is at Norfolk Va. he phoned Sunday night and I am waiting now for a phone call from him.

I have been doing Canteen Work for Red Cross I am where the Coast Guards are training dogs, but it will be 2 or 3 weeks before I can resume my work. I usually have 20 to 25 pies to make for there lunch. I enjoy it. I would like to be a cook for.

the boys in some Army Camps. The food is good that the government buys, but the cooks spoil it, some of them never cooked before.

We are a small community and of course there isn't much activity, only to the boys. Some people won't do anything, so I work with the County Red Cross.

We have no camps near us, like you have
