
I trust that you and O.B. are enjoying the best of health and everything is going lovely for you.

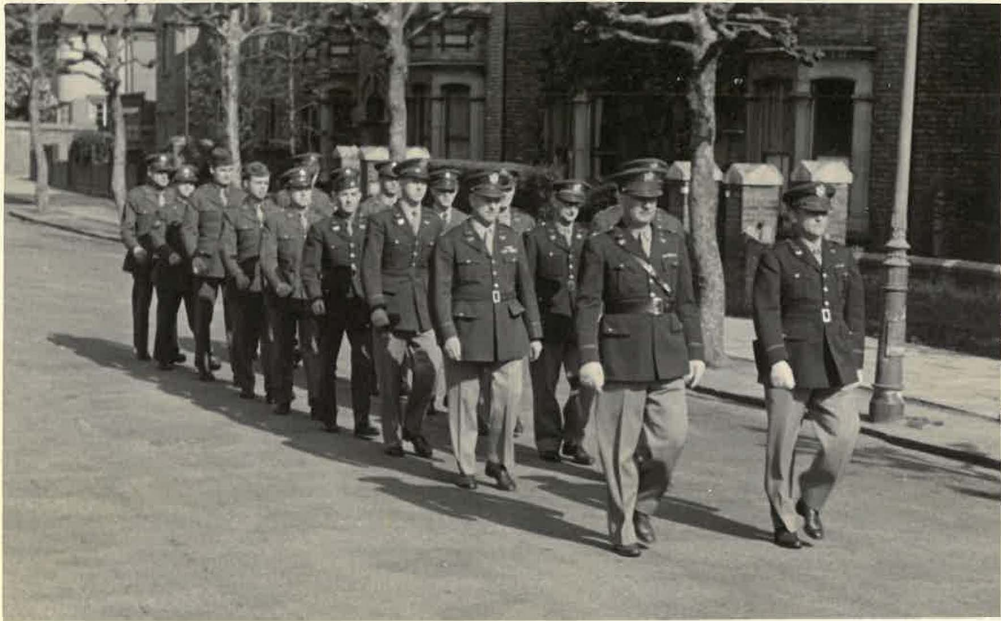
