Received your leaflet of information on the boys in service and I certainly appreciated it.

I haven't heard from anyone in the States for six months, this is, until your letter reached me this morning.

I am now working in a hospital in N. Africa. I am working for Chaplain Collins as a member of a special service unit.

We hold services in a large tent that is used for a theater when it is not in use as a church. Attendance is so good that there is always an overflow at both Catholic and Protestant services.
