I have before me your kind letter of 12-20-43 — The delay in arrival was due to my recent change of address — I would like to thank you for the letter and tell you how much it means to hear from old acquaintances —

I have ^{been} in England for about 8 months now — Although I am a firm believer in the adage "There is No Place Like Home", I will always remember my experiences here — The war, with all its horrors, has given many of us a broader outlook

toward the different peoples of the world that we would doubtless ever have experienced otherwise I have been perhaps fortunate since I arrived in that I have been transferred several times which has accounted for quite a bit of sight-seeing all over England. I have had the privilege of seeing London, Coventry, Shrewsbury, Cambridge, Oxford, Hull, Birmingham, and Glasgow - The British weather lives up to its reputation and a London fog is something to see -

Although England is ^{not} generally considered a "combat zone" for non-flying personnel of the air forces, I feel sure that all of us will have some "great" stories

to tell once we are home -
Having lived with a great number
of flying personnel, I can assure
you that "There are no atheists
in the air over Germany" all of
us have, at one time or another, been
spiritually affected by the war -

I have been receiving the
church bulletins regularly and
they have always been welcome.
I read them over several times
each time I receive them -
