Dear Mr. Anderson,

I've intended to write you before now to express my appreciation for the personal note you sent in with the church's remembrance at Christmas time. I also want to thank you, and the others connected, for making possible the monthly bulletins. They are really chock full of home town news. Thanks again for your interest in me.

now I come to the thing that finally made me write instead of putting it off for another day. I have made application for Chaplain training under the Navy's V-12 College training program. Yesterday I was examined by the board (2 Lt. Comdrs, + one Lt.) and this morning my Personnel Officer notified me to go to the Chaplain's office to be interviewed by them. That was a request made by the board which examined me yesterday. I talked a good long while with the two Chaplains, one prot. + one catholic. They suggested me writing you for

advice concerning this training. They also thought it advisable to have a letter of recommendation from you. Now please don't think I want you to build me up just to help me out now. I would appreciate a letter from you, however, if you have time to write it for me.

My supreme desire now is to serve my Saviour & Lord Jesus Christ. He gave His all for me that I might have life and now I want to tell others of Christ's love for them.

I have left my all up to Him & in the question of V-12 He has been given complete charge. I want His Will to be done in my life.
